Dispensationalism And The History Of

Dispensationalism is a religious interpretive system and metanarrative for the Bible. It considers biblical history as divided by God into dispensations, defined periods or ages to which God has allotted distinctive administrative principles. According to dispensationalism, each age of God's plan is thus administered in a certain way, and humanity is held responsible as a steward during that time.

What is dispensationalism?

Question: "What is dispensational premillennialism / premillennial dispensationalism?" Answer: Premillennialism as a system is primarily based on a literal method of biblical interpretation. The main premise of premillennialism is that Jesus will literally return to the earth before (pre) the millennium begins and that He himself will inaugurate and rule over it.

Darby's dispensationalism aimed to explain the distinguishable economies in God's redemptive purpose. He saw a distinction between Israel and the Church and taught seven dispensations: Paradise, Noah, Abraham, Israel, Gentiles, the Spirit, and the Millennium. Darby's division of history wasn't a radical theological change.
