The Functional Independence Measure (FIM) 31 is a widely accepted functional assessment measure used during inpatient rehabilitation. The FIM is an 18-item ordinal scale, used with all diagnoses within a rehabilitation population. FIM scores range from 1 to 7 (1 = total assist and 7 = complete independence).

Functional change is a key outcome measure of rehabilitation episodes. The FIM™ instrument comprises 18 items, each of which is assessed against a seven point ordinal scale, where the higher the score for an item, the more independently the patient is able to perform the tasks assessed by that item. Total scores range from 18 to 126.

The Functional Independence Measurement (FIM) is an outcome measurement tool used by physical therapists and other healthcare professionals to measure overall independence during specific functional tasks. It is most often used in acute hospitals and subacute rehabilitation settings, although it can be used anywhere for patients who have functional mobility impairments.

IRF-PAI was developed for the CMS and is based in large part on the Functional Independence Measure (FIM), a tool comprised of eighteen assessment items related to motor activities and cognitive skills, each item being accompanied by a rating scale of one to seven, designating level of dependence. 110 The sum of item scores describes severity of disability and reflects how much assistance is required to complete activities of daily living (ADLs).

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The Functional Independence Measurement (FIM) application allows multiple clinicians (inter-disciplinary assessment) to complete a FIM assessment and document it in the medical record as a progress note and/or as a response to a consult.

Scoring. Each item is scored on a 7 point ordinal scale ranging from 1 (total dependence) to a score of 7 (total independence). The scoring considers the use of adaptive equipment and/or the extent of personal assistance or supervision required to complete the task.
