There are two Neolithic sites at the Knap of Howar [reference: Prehistoric Scotland, MacSween and Sharp], each built about 3400 BCE. Curiously, the settlers there sunk their houses deep in an existing midden (a refuse pile), so they almost appear to be underground burrows, or almost prehistoric defensive shelters.
